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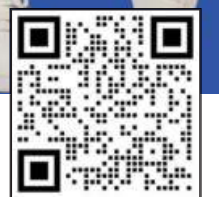

World leaders pledge to save forests, cut methane emissions

90 countries join U.S.-EU plan at COP26; India, China, Russia yet to sign up

Leaders at the COP26 global climate conference in Glasgow have pledged to stop deforestation by the end of the decade and slash emissions of the greenhouse gas, methane, to help slow climate change.

The inability of major powers so far to agree more broadly on rapid reductions in the use of fossil fuels, the main cause of man-made global warming, has upset the poorer, smaller countries likely to suffer its worst effects.

Surangel Whipps Jr, President of Palau, a Pacific state of 500 low-lying islands under threat from rising sea levels, told the leaders of the G20 industrial powers in a speech: "We are drowning and our only hope is the lifeline you are holding."

Nearly 90 countries have joined a U.S.- and EU-led effort to slash emissions of methane 30% by 2030 from 2020 levels, a senior Biden administration official said ahead of a formal announcement on Tuesday.

The Global Methane Pledge, first announced in September, now covers emissions from two-thirds of the global economy, according to the U.S. official. Among the signatories is Brazil — one of the five biggest

emitters of methane, which is generated in cows' digestive systems, in landfill waste and in oil and gas production. Three others — China, Russia and India — have not signed up. Australia has said it will not back the pledge.

\$19 billion for forests

In 2020, the world lost 2,58,000 sq. km of forests according to the Global Forest Watch. The conservation charity WWF estimates that 27 football fields of forest are

lost every minute.

Over 100 national leaders pledged to halt and reverse deforestation and land degradation by the end of the decade, underpinned by \$19 billion in public and private funds to invest in protecting and restoring forests.

The agreement expands a commitment by 40 countries as part of the 2014 New York Declaration of Forests. COP26 aims to keep alive a receding target of capping global warming at 1.5 de-

grees Celsius above pre-industrial levels to avert still greater damage from heatwaves, droughts, floods and coastal damage that climate change is already causing.

Under the agreement, 12 countries pledged to provide \$12 billion of public funding between 2021 and 2025 for developing countries to restore degraded land and tackle wildfires.

Set up police complaints bodies: NHRC

Fifteen years after the Supreme Court issued directions for police reforms, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has asked the Union Home Ministry and the State Governments to set up police complaints authorities as per the judgment in the *Prakash Singh vs Union of India*, 2006, case.

The NHRC's core advisory group on criminal justice system reforms has said there is an "immediate need to set up police complaints authorities at the State/UT and district level" as per the Supreme Court's directives, according to the minutes of its meeting published on Tuesday. The core group, which met on August 18, recommended to the MHA and the States that the status of compliance should be displayed on the websites of the Ministry and the State Home Departments.

The NHRC group also said the MHA and the Law Ministry should consider implementing the recommendations of the 113th report of the Law Commission to add Section 114 B to the Indian Evidence Act.

This would ensure that if a person sustains injuries in custody, it is presumed that the injuries were inflicted by the police.

Byelection results on Tuesday threw up a mixed bag for the BJP and the Congress, with the BJP losing all four Himachal Pradesh seats to the Congress, but securing its victory in Assam with the help of defectors from the Congress.

The Trinamool Congress swept the four West Bengal Assembly seats.

The results to the byelections to three Lok Sabha seats and 30 Assembly seats in 14 States and one Union Territory were a mixed bag for the BJP. The party lost the Himachal Pradesh Lok Sabha seat of Mandi, which is the home district of its Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur, to the Congress' Pratib-

ha Singh, wife of late former Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Virbhadr Singh. However, the BJP and its ally won all five seats in Assam. In Haryana, the Indian National Lok Dal leader Abhay Chautala won the Ellenabad Assembly seat. Mr. Chautala had resigned his seat earlier this year to express solidarity with the protesting farmers, leading to the byelection.

The YSRCP retained the Badvel Assembly seat in Andhra Pradesh, while the BJP won from Huzurabad in Telangana. The Janata Dal (United) won the two Bihar Assembly seats. In Karnataka, the BJP and Congress won one seat each.

Amarinder quits Cong., announces new party

'Deeply hurt by Gandhi family conduct'

Former Punjab Chief Minister and Congress leader Captain Amarinder Singh (retd.) on Tuesday tendered his resignation from the party, stating that he was hurt by the conduct of party president Sonia Gandhi and her children — Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra.

He also announced the name of his new party — 'Punjab Lok Congress'. It would be formally launched later, he said.

In his letter to party president Sonia Gandhi, Capt. Singh said: "I actually felt deeply hurt by your conduct and that of your children who I still deeply love as much as my own children, having known their father, since we were in school to-

gether since 1954, which is for 67 years now."

He said he hoped that no other senior Congressperson was subjected to the ignominy that he was put through.

In his letter, Capt. Singh revealed that Congress leaders were involved in illegal sand mining. "As far as the issue of illegal sand mining was concerned, the offenders unfortunately were the substantive bulk of Congress MLAs and Ministers, including an overwhelming number in the current Government. One of my enduring regrets would remain as to why I did not take some of them to task. The thought that it would embarrass the party held me back. However, I intend on making the list of these people public," he wrote.

City's air quality drops to 'very poor' level

Situation to remain same till Deepavali

The Capital's air quality worsened to the "very poor" level on Tuesday and is expected to remain in the same category for the next two days, according to official data.

The contribution of stubble burning in neighbouring States to PM2.5, a chief pollutant, in Delhi is expected to go up from 6% on Tuesday to 20%-38% on Deepavali and the next two days, said government-run monitoring agency SAFAR (System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research) in a statement.

The number of active fire counts in the region was 1,795 on Tuesday.

"Delhi's AQI is in the very poor category and likely to

remain so for the next two days," said SAFAR.

The AQI of Delhi was 303 on Tuesday, up from 281 on Monday, according to the Central Pollution Control Board's 4 p.m. bulletin, which is an average of the past 24 hours and is considered the day's AQI.

Pakistan's NSA to skip Indian conference on Afghanistan

Calling India a "spoiler" in Afghanistan, Pakistan's National Security Adviser Moeed Yusuf said he would not accept the Modi Government's invitation to the meeting of regional security chiefs being organised in Delhi next week.

Mr. Yusuf was speaking to the Pakistani media after a meeting with Uzbekistan's Secretary of the Security Council Lt. Gen. Viktor Makhmudov, who was in Islamabad for the Establishment of a Joint Security Commission

with Pakistan, and has also been invited to the conference in Delhi.

Confirmations received
 Diplomatic sources said Gen. Makhmudov is likely to attend the conference. India

has also received confirmations from other invitees, including Russia, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan and Tajikistan.

The Chinese Government has not yet confirmed if it will send a security official to the conference, mainly because of strict quarantine regulations in place there, an official told *The Hindu*. India is pursuing a videoconference appearance if no Chinese delegate travels to Delhi.

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Delhi Govt. restarts free entrance coaching

15,000 students have applied for the scheme, says Minister

The Delhi Government has restarted a scheme under which students can get free coaching for various competitive exams at private coaching centres if the annual income of their families is less than ₹8 lakh.

A total of 15,000 students have applied for Jai Bhim Mukhyamantri Pratibha Vikas Yojana, and all the available seats for the scheme have been filled, Social Welfare Minister Rajendra Pal Gautam said on Tuesday. The classes will begin soon, he added.

The scheme, which was started in 2018, was discontinued in 2020 after the COVID-19 pandemic hit the city.

To get the benefits, a student should have passed Classes X and XII from a Delhi school and should meet the eligibility criteria of the competitive exam he/she is

For the students

- Free coaching for various competitive exams at private coaching centres, if the student's annual family income is less than ₹8 lakh

- A student should have passed Classes X and XII from a school in Delhi and should meet the eligibility criteria of the competitive exam he/she is preparing for

- The scheme is available for JEE, NEET, CLAT, Civil Services, banking, railways, SSC and other exams

preparing for. The scheme is available for JEE, NEET, CLAT, Civil Services, banking, railways, SSC and other competitive exams and a stipend of ₹2,500 is also given to each student, apart from the course fee, to meet the travel expenses.

"The Government has made arrangements and issued notices in newspapers

for reopening of offline coaching classes. Under the scheme, 15,000 talented students of Delhi have enrolled themselves with the 46 empanelled institutes," the Minister said.

A student can register for the scheme at the institute from where he/she takes coaching. If that institute is not one of the 46 empanelled coaching centres, then the Government will give the student up to ₹1 lakh if found eligible and ₹40,000 for extra subjects.

Mr. Gautam said certain big institutes like Vajiram for Civil Services, or FIITJEE and Aakash for engineering and medical exams are not on the list. "They did not participate even after we requested," he said.

'Chargesheet in riots case was communal'

The anti-CAA protest was secular but the chargesheet in the Delhi riots conspiracy case was communal and the police fabricated a story to suit their narrative, former JNU student leader Umar Khalid told a court here on Tuesday, calling it a "naked form of false implication".

Senior advocate Trideep Pais, appearing for Mr. Khalid, made the remarks during a hearing on his bail plea in a case related to the communal violence that broke out in Delhi in February 2020.

Mr. Pais said the chargesheet was a fertile imagination of the police, calling the investigating officer a scriptwriter who "literally wrote a novel". "No recovery, not present in Delhi, no violence attributed to me, no traces of funding," Mr. Pais told the court while opposing the police's allegations.

Forum to launch campaign to counter namaz disruptions

Gurugram DC sets up committee to resolve issue

Gurgaon Nagrik Ekta Manch, a citizens' forum, on Tuesday announced that it would launch a public awareness campaign, countering hatred, fake news and false allegations with reason and facts on the controversy surrounding the offering of Friday prayers (Jumma Namaz) in the open.

Addressing a press conference, Manch co-founder Altaf Ahmad said Muslims were obligated to offer Jumma Namaz in a congregation and ideally, the prayer would be in a mosque. But there were

only a handful of mosques in the city.

He added that the community had voluntarily reduced the number of sites for Friday prayers to less than one-third in 2018, and none of the sites obstructed traffic or caused any inconvenience to others. "There is not a single case in any police station about namazis harassing women or indulging in crime," said Mr. Ahmad.

Meanwhile, office-bearers of Sanyukt Hindu Sangharsh Samiti held a meeting with Deputy Commissioner Yash Garg. Dr. Garg put forth the viewpoints of the administra-

tion and the Muslim community on the matter, and set up a joint committee with representations of all the three stakeholders to meet on Wednesday, said the Samiti leaders.

Samiti's president Mahavir Bhardwaj claimed that some Muslim groups had given their consent to not hold Friday prayers at public places, but their agitation would continue till the administration comes out with an official order. The Samiti leaders reiterated that they would go ahead with their programme to hold "Govardhan Pooja" at namaz sites on November 5.

Fake movers and packers firm busted

Two former employees of Agarwal Packers and Movers have been arrested for allegedly creating fake websites of the company and duping customers by posing as repre-

sentatives of the firm, Delhi Police said on Tuesday.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime) Manoj C said the accused have been identified as Ashish Singh and Deepak Goel, and efforts are on to nab their associate - Su-

resh Chauhan.

Mr. Singh lost his job with the company during the lockdown in March last year. Later, he contacted Mr. Goel who stole data from the company's server. The data was then sent to Mr. Chauhan.

JD(U) retains both Assembly seats in Bihar by-elections

Comfortable win in Kusheshwarsthan, close fight in Tarapur

The ruling Janata Dal (United) in Bihar retained both Assembly seats in the State on Tuesday by defeating Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) candidates. In Kusheshwarsthan, JD(U) won comfortably while in Tarapur it was a close contest. Bypolls to both seats were held on October 30.

In Kusheshwarsthan (Darbhanga), Aman Bhushan Hazari (JD(U)) defeated Ganesh Bharti (RJD) by over 12,000 votes. In Tarapur (Munger) Rajeev Kumar Singh (JD(U)) won the seat against Arun Kumar Shah (RJD) by a thin margin of 3,821 votes. Mr. Hazari is son of Maheshwar Hazari, whose death resulted in the Kusheshwarsthan bypoll, while in Tarapur it was due to the death of Mewalal Choudhary. Soon after the results were announced, RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav, who was campaigning at Darbhanga to monitor the result of Kusheshwarsthan, said: "We fought hard

at Kusheshwarsthan, where our party had never contested, but the JD(U) candidate got sympathy votes as well. We respect people's mandate as we believe in democracy but people of Bihar need change and change will come." The Congress has been contesting from Kusheshwarsthan as part of the mahagathbandhan. In the 2020 Assembly polls, Ashok Kumar (Congress) was defeated by Maheshwar Hazari by over 7,000 votes. This time too the Congress wanted to stake claim to this seat but RJD chose to put up its own candidate, which wi-

dened the rift between the parties and they fielded their own candidates.

However, Congress candidates Rajesh Kumar Mishra and Atirek Kumar at Tarapur and Kusheshwarsthan managed to get only a few thousands votes. "We admit that people at both places did not take any notice of Congress but we'll mull and strengthen our position gradually," senior State Congress leader Prem Chandra Mishra said. The bypolls had become a prestige issue for JD(U) and RJD. Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and a host of JD(U) and BJP leaders campaigned hard in both constituencies. RJD chief Lalu Prasad too jumped into the ring and addressed two well-attended public meetings.

"Though, the Congress candidates couldn't do much at both places, the ruling party campaign managed to create confusion among voters by talking of the rift between RJD and Congress," said political analyst Ajay Kumar.

Results ring alarm bells for Cong. in M.P.

The Bharatiya Janata Party bagged one Lok Sabha and two Assembly seats in the bypolls in Madhya Pradesh, setting alarm bells ringing for the Congress.

The BJP has retained Khandwa LS seat and wrested Jobat (ST) and Prithivpur seats from the Congress. However, the Congress wrested Raigaon (SC) Assembly seat from the BJP.

Though there have been big gains for CM Shivrang Singh Chouhan, there is some cause for worry as the BJP's 2019 victory margin in Khandwa has shrunk to 50,000.

The Congress's triple loss is the worst news for the Opposition after the Kamal Nath government fell in March 2020. Prithivpur and Jobat were last represented by Brajendra Singh Rathore and Kalawati Bhuria respectively.

The party's win in Raigaon after 31 years is the only good news.

Blatter, Platini charged with fraud

Former FIFA officials Sepp Blatter and Michel Platini were charged with fraud and other offences by Swiss prosecutors on Tuesday after a six-year investigation into a controversial \$2 million payment.

The 85-year-old Blatter and 65-year-old Platini now face a trial within months at federal criminal court in Bellinzona. "This payment damaged FIFA's assets and unlawfully enriched Platini," Swiss federal prosecutors said in a statement.

The case from September 2015 ousted Blatter ahead of schedule as FIFA president and ended then-UEFA president Platini's campaign to succeed his former mentor.

The case centers on Plati-

ni's written request to FIFA in January 2011 to be paid backdated additional salary for working as a presidential advisor in Blatter's first term, from 1998-2002.

Blatter authorised FIFA to make the payment within weeks. He was preparing to campaign for re-election

against Mohamed bin Hamam of Qatar, where Platini's influence with European voters was a key factor.

Both Blatter and Platini have long denied wrongdoing and cited a verbal agreement they had made, now more than 20 years ago, for the money to be paid.
